its incredible versatility, for over 3 months the space that is normally the home of engaged exhibition attendees or dance party enthusiasts was home to major broadcasters from around the world, as well as the all-important VAR system. There were a few nerves jangling by us all as footage from all matches was fed back to Halls 5 and 6 and then beamed around the world to the 2 billion viewers that tuned in. In this vein, Sydney Showground was also honoured to host two pre-match functions for 'Matildas Family and Friends' as they undertook their Round of 16 and Quarter-Final matches in Sydney Olympic Park.

Continuing in sport, the GWS GIANTS surged through the back end of the season to clinch a finals berth. Playing an amazing brand of football, we look forward to welcoming a re-invigorated fan-base in season 2024. But it hasn't been all ball-sports, with the consumer exhibition season also in full-swing. There was something for everyone at Sydney Showground, with Supanova, Western Sydney Careers Expo, Pregnancy Babies & Children Expo, National 4x4 Outdoors Show, Sydney Craft & Quilt Fair, Disability Expo, Sydney's Annual Wedding Expo, Dog & Cat Lovers Festivals, Cake Bake & Sweets Show and Oz Comic-Con all delivering outstanding 2023 editions.

And hot off the press, Mandopop sensation, Jay Chou will be returning to GIANTS Stadium on March 2 as part of his Carnival World Tour. 

HOME OF THE FIFA WOMEN'S WORLD CUP INTERNATIONAL BROADCAST CENTRE



The 2023 FIFA Women's World Cup delivered heart stopping entertainment across Australia and New Zealand throughout July and August.

Working 24/7 to make sure these incredible games were accessible and viewable worldwide was the 2023 FIFA Women's World Cup International Broadcast Centre (IBC), located in the heart of Sydney Olympic Park at Sydney Showground.

After 107 days of transforming 9,500 sqm of Sydney Showground's Halls 5 & 6 into a broadcast production and telecommunications hub for the Tournament, the party has officially come to an end, with the IBC closing its doors for the final time in early September.

The execution of the International Broadcast Centre was no easy feat. It pushed Sydney Showground as a venue to ensure the highest quality of service was delivered while also executing surrounding events for key clients.

In total, 2.5km of temporary walls were erected, utilising approximately 3,800 sheets of gyprock and 3,500 sqm of carpet was laid. To ensure no kick, goal or save was missed approximately 15km of power cables were installed, and three types of power were utilised. In the café over 6,779 cups of tea and coffee, 5,560 hot meals and 1,296 pies and sausage rolls kept the FIFA team going.

The 2023 Women's World Cup legacy will remain for decades to come and become a hallmark moment in Sydney Showground's history.
